FBC Kountze also served as a drop-off location again for shoeboxes during the 2024 National Collection Week November 18-25 and collected 1800 shoeboxes from area churches during that week. Thanks to all the volunteers who helped collect shoeboxes and pack them into cartons during National Collection Week. The Big Thicket Area collected a total of 7138 shoeboxes for 2024.

It's never too early to start collecting items for 2025 shoeboxes. So start today collecting appropriate shoebox items that you find on sale. There are usually suggested items listed in the church bulletin each month, which can be placed in the designated cubicles in the church foyer by the nursery. Monetary donations can be made monthly to the Operation Christmas Designated Fund to purchase items and help pay for the shipping costs of the shoeboxes. 




Praise & Worship
